JUDGING GUIDELINES

LED CLASSES:

Buckskins and Duns (remembering some horses carry both Buckskin & Dun genes) are always shown together in Breed classes. This is because in these classes we are looking at conformation, temperament and trueness to breed type above all, not colour. **'A good horse is never a bad colour'**.

All horses registered display or have been proven to carry correct colour genetics to be registered with the Association. Due to the vast differences in Buckskin and Dun colour, asking a judge to consider colour as well in a general halter class is impractical. These classes may be split by height at larger shows.

Colour Classes are always split. With **Buckskins** (cream gene only), including Cream Buckskin, Typical Buckskin (golden), Brown Buckskin, Dark Brown Buckskin and Black Buckskin, They do not have a true dorsal stripe or other primal markings, and should have clarity in their body coat.

Dun = Red Dun (chestnut) Bay Dun, Brown Dun and Black Dun who do not have a true dorsal stripe or other primal markings, we are looking for clarity in body coat.

Buckskin/Dun carry both cream and a dun gene (either D or D1). And vary according to there collective gene makeup.
